ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

EDINBURGH COMMUNITY HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION, INC.

I, the undersigned, natural person of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more, do hereby submit these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina entitled "Nonprofit Corporation Act," and to that end do hereby set forth:

- 1. The name of the corporation is Edinburgh Community Homeowners' Association, Inc.
- 2. The address of the initial registered office of the corporation in the State of North Carolina is 442 ½ E. Main Street, Clayton, North Carolina 27520, Johnston County, North Carolina; and the name of its initial registered agent is James W. Lee.
- 3. The name and address of the incorporator is Lawrence E. Kristoff, II, 444 E. Main Street, Clayton, North Carolina 27520.
- 4. The street address and mailing address of the principal office of the corporation is 442 ½ E. Main Street, Clayton, North Carolina 27520, Johnston County, North Carolina.
- 5. The corporation will have members with such designations, rights, powers, and privileges as provided in the bylaws.
- 7. Upon dissolution of the corporation, the assets thereof shall, after all liabilities and obligations of the corporation have been paid, or adequate provision made therefor, be distributed as set forth in the bylaws.
 - 8. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is to operate and manage the

Edinburgh Homeowners' Association in compliance with the Bylaws and Covenants for Edinburgh Subdivision located in Johnston County, North Carolina.

- 9. The corporation shall be authorized to do all things necessary or convenient to carry out its affairs, including without limitation, the following powers:
 - To sue and be sued, complain and defend in its corporate name;
 - b. To make and amend bylaws not inconsistent with its articles of incorporation or with the laws of this State, for regulating and managing the affairs of the corporation;
 - c. To purchase, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, and own, hold, improve, use, and otherwise deal with, real or personal property, or any legal or equitable interest in property, wherever located;
 - To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange, and otherwise dispose
 of all or any part of its property;
 - e. To make contracts and guarantees, incur liabilities, borrow money, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of any of its property, franchises, or income;
 - f. To conduct its affairs, locate offices, and exercise the powers granted by law within or without this State;
 - g. To elect or appoint directors, officers, employees, and agents of the corporation, define their duties, and fix their compensation;
 - h. To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, religious, cultural, scientific, or educational purposes, and to make payments or donations not inconsistent with law for other purposes that further the

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corporate interest;

i. To impose dues, assessments, admission and transfer fees upon its

members;

j. To establish conditions for admission of members, admit members and

issue memberships;

10. The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be

determined at the initial meeting of the corporation.

11. To the fullest extent permitted by the North Carolina Nonprofit Corporation Act as

it exists or may hereafter be amended, no person who is serving or who has served as a director of

the corporation shall be personally liable for monetary damages for breach of any duty as a

director. No amendment or repeal of this article, nor the adoption of any other amendment to these

Articles of Incorporation inconsistent with this article, shall eliminate or reduce the protection

granted herein with respect to any matter that occurred prior to such amendment, repeal, or

adoption.
